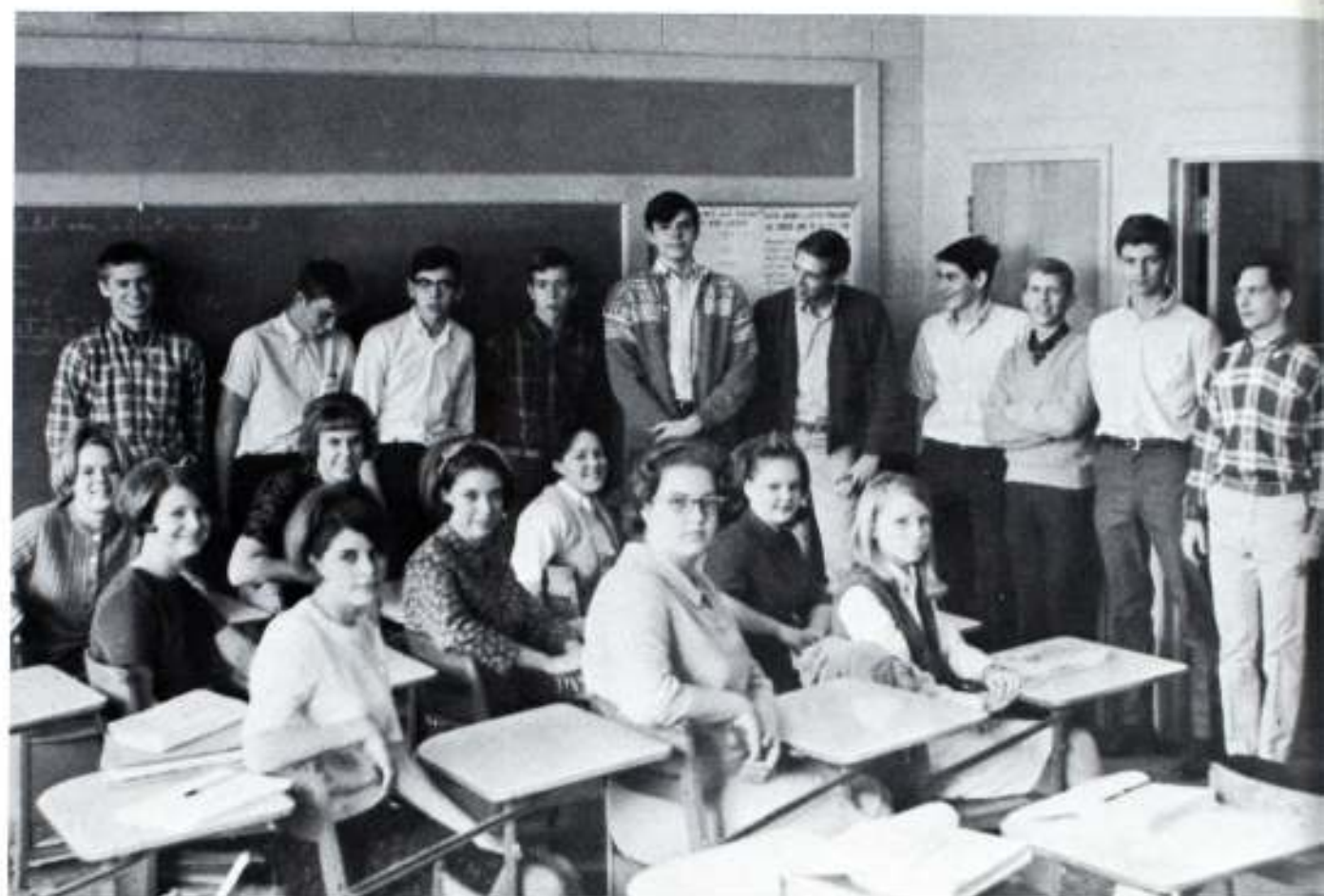

Defense Triumphs

The proud Mac Brahma defense, who proved to be quite a bit tougher than expected, turned back the potent Austin Maroons repeatedly on September 17 in Austin's House Park Stadium. The Austin team controlled the ball most of the game although they were continually held from sight of the Brahma goal line.

Dutch Riefler led the Brahma attack with 92 yards on 22 carries, picking up 6 more yards than MacArthur's total offense. The stocky fullback also scored the Brahma's only touchdown of the night on a four yard off-tackle play. Jon Ylitalo kicked the extra point. With 1:59 remaining Austin quarterback Jim Geary tossed a 9 yard TD to Danny Covert. The Maroons went for a 2 point conversion try, but the pass was bottled down by alert defender Jeff Davis.

The Maroons tried a successful onside kick, got to the 22 on a run by Geary and then advanced to the 11 yard line. A pass interference play gave Austin a first down on the Brahma 1. This was one of the many times the Big Blue held. Four times they tried to penetrate the forward wall of the Brahmas; they never scored. The MacArthur defense was led by Jeff Davis, Bill Payne, Eric Lake, Bobby Hahn and Charles Gremmel.

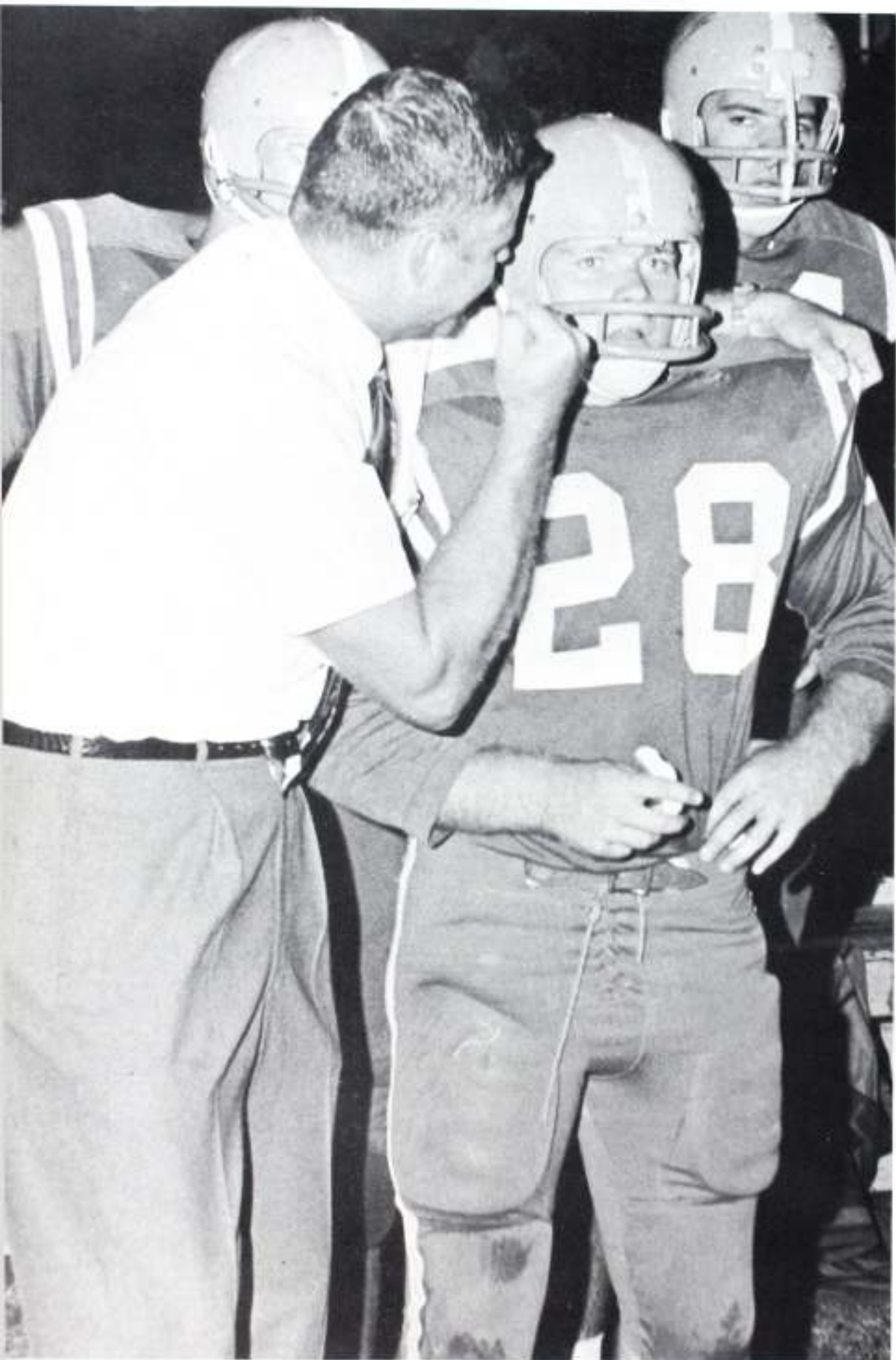

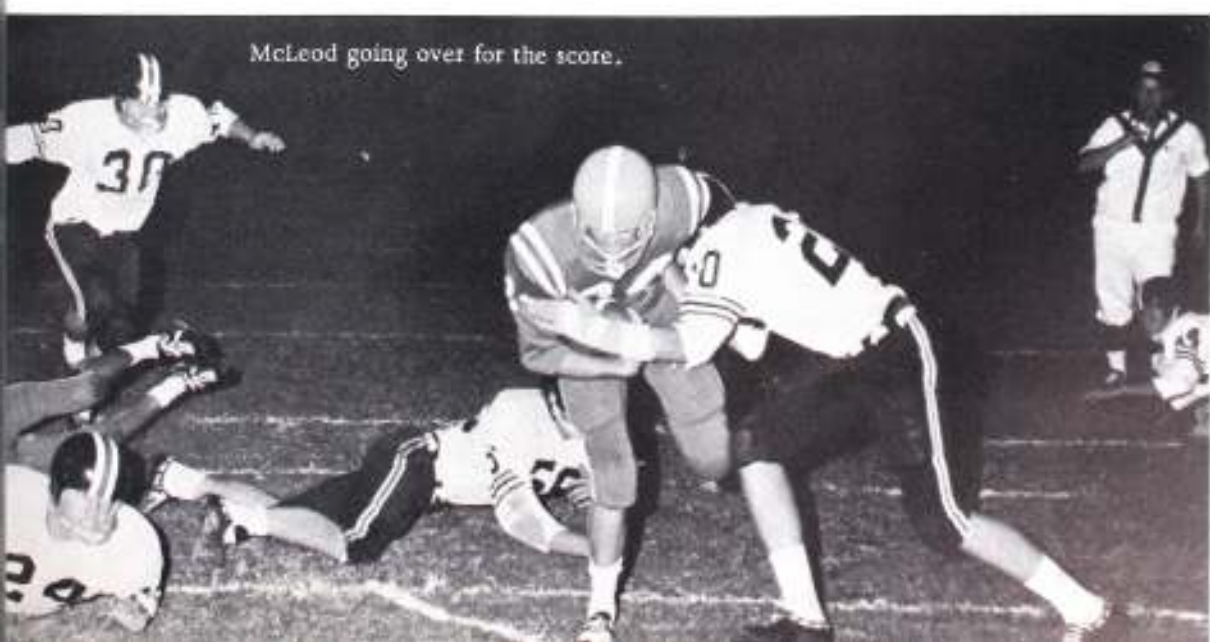

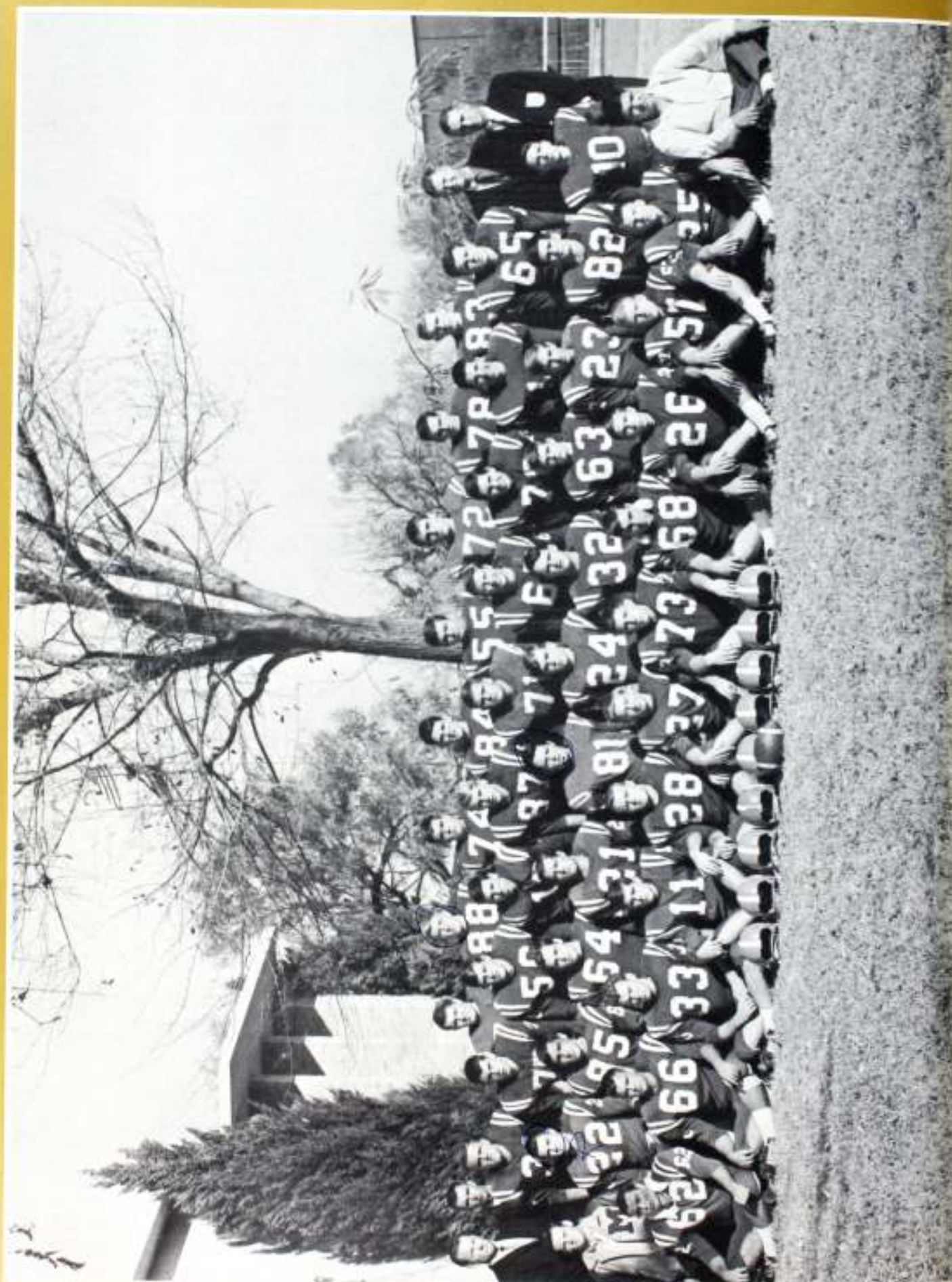
Al Hook was the leading ground gainer with 82 yards. McLeod also had 66 yards for the Brahmas.

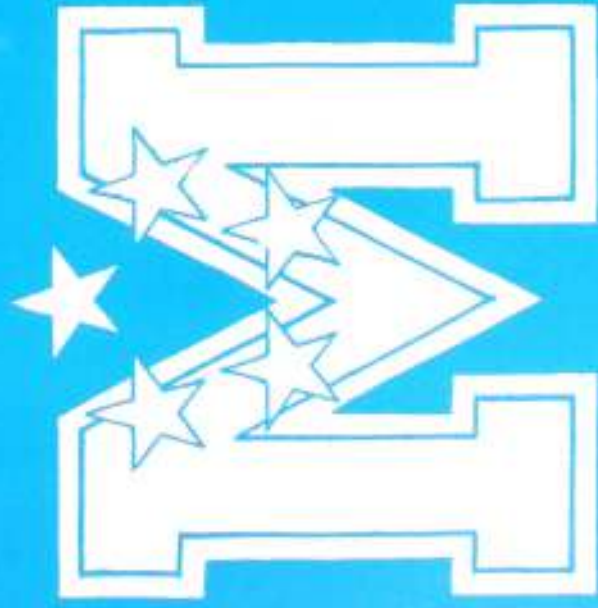

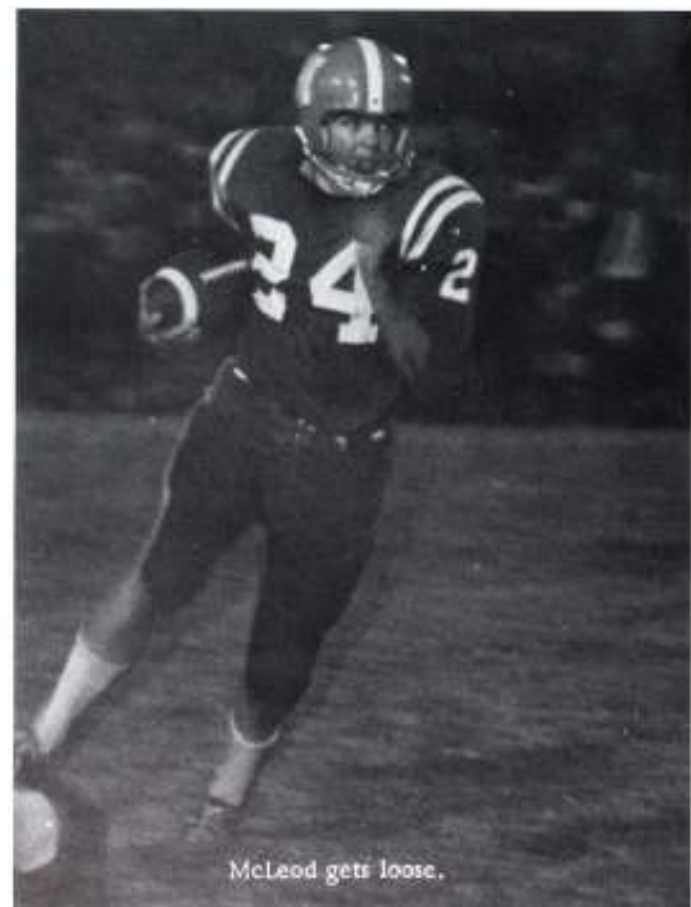
The Blue Cloud

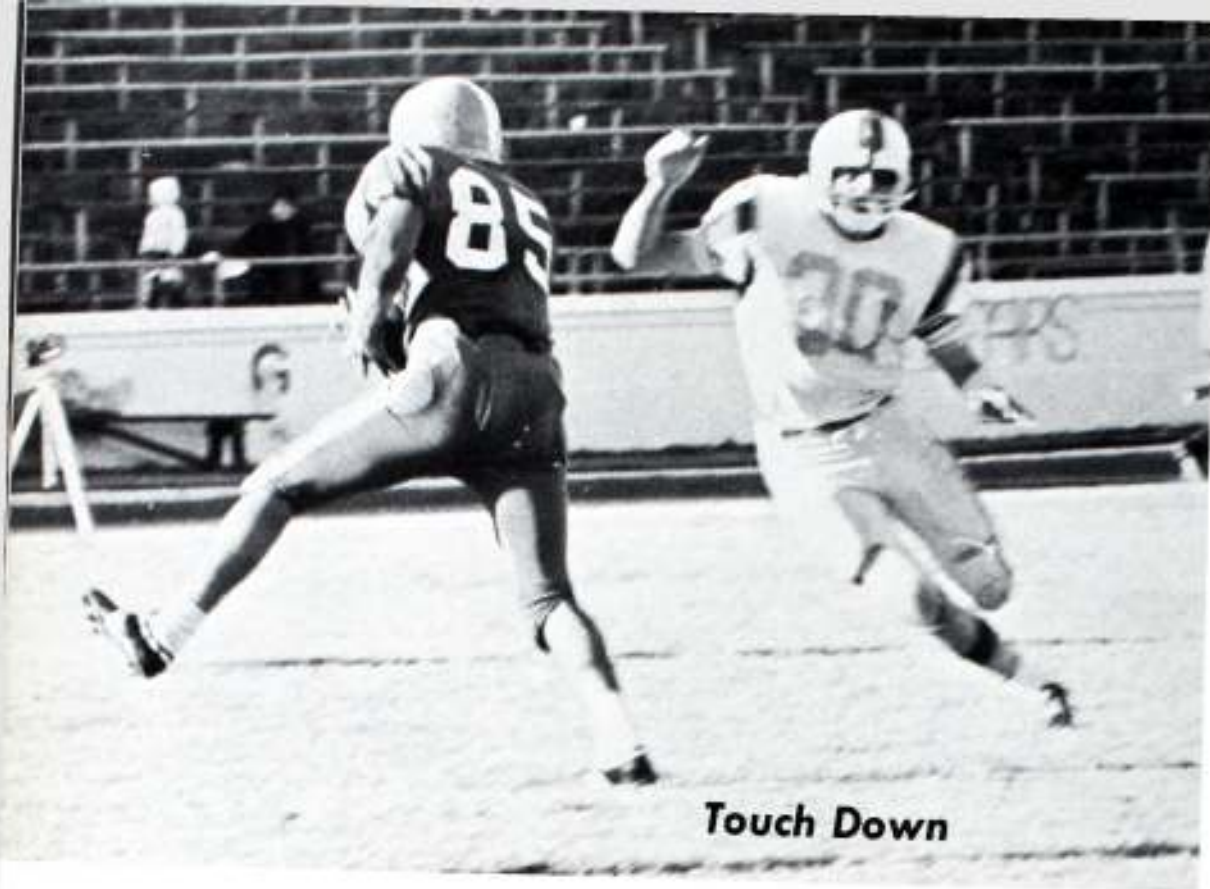
Soon after the opening kickoff, Rick Oberlies recovered an Alice fumble. Five plays later Fullback Dutch Riefler blasted over for the touchdown.
