












## Defense Triumphs




Soon after the opening kickoff, Rick Oberlies recovered an Alice fumble. Five plays later Fullback Dutch Riefler blasted over for the touchdown.










### Brahma Baseball

Under the guidance of Coach John Porter, the Brahmas also sport one of the youngest teams in the city, with six juniors in the starting lineup,


The Big Blue poses as a strong threat to the district title as they captured the North Zone American Legion championship last summer.
